A message from your LPU Commander



It gives me tremendous pleasure to report that Rutlands policing team has done really well in reducing crime and anti social behaviour (ASB) in the last twelve months.

You are less likely to have your home burgled, or suffer from an act of ASB in Rutland. Burglary dwellings have been reduced by a staggering 51% or, from 89 burglaries last year to 44 this year. That means 45 less victims of burglary. To have fewer victims of burglaries is all the more pleasing because this year's 51% reduction completes a three year downward trend. Last year's was a 27.7% burglary reduction and the previous years 24%. Its not all good news though, theft from motor vehicles has increased slightly from 103 to 106 this year and theft of motor vehicles has also increased slightly from 36 to 40 mainly due to rural crime and agricultural/plant vehicles being stolen. Excellent news to end with as reports of anti-social behaviour across Rutland are down by 21%. The number of incidents reported to your local police has reduced from 950 to 751 - a reduction of 199 reports of ASB.

Neighbourhood update

Listed below are the priorities you told us about three months ago and how we tackled them:

You told us...

Theft from unattended motor vehicles which are parked in lanes and verges around Rutland Water. These incidents are happening during the opening hours for Rutland Water Car Parks.

We responded...

by increasing police patrols in the area, liaising with partner agencies, such as Ward Councillors and Anglian Water officials. We have liaised with other forces compiling intelligence and strategy plans on persons suspected of vehicle crime in the area. We have written to over 120 registered keepers of vehicles where items of property have been seen left on display, advising them about crime prevention issues. As a result, since January, there has been only one vehicle broken into around the Rutland Water area, which is great news. Historically, the summer period is when the majority of vehicle crime occurs and so we are continuing this priority for another 6 months.

You told us...

To tackle the anti-social behaviour and criminal damage occurring in Ashwell village overnight on Wednesday evenings.

We responded...

by increasing police presence in the area at the relevant and other key times. By partnership working with Leicestershire Youth Offending Service, this has instigated visits by the Impact Team who attended and spoke to local youths and residents. We provided crime prevention advice to those suffering damage and explored ways of identifying those responsible for damage caused to date. Whilst it has not, at this time, been possible to bring any convictions, enquiries will continue and any further evidence will be acted upon. There have been no further reported incidents of criminal damage or anti social behaviour in this area. The area will continue to receive attention to ensure that problems do not re-occur.
